Through the Conference, ISCBC plays a key role in bridging the gap between researchers and practitioners, ultimately building capacity for effective invasive species management and control.

About the Research Conference

The complex nature of invasive species issues and their increasing prevalence on a global scale calls for coordination among those involved in academic research and applied practice. Since inception, ISCBC has recognized the value of knowledge exchange and has played an instrumental role in convening researchers and practitioners alike to bridge the gap between science and action. Facilitating dialogue related to the latest research brings attention to emerging issues and new management techniques, subsequently inspiring further research, promoting networking and new collaborations, and informing improved operational approaches.

The 2021 Invasive Species Research Conference will take place on an interactive virtual event portal over two half-days, on October 6th-7th, 2021.

History of the Conference

In response to increasing demand, the first Invasive Plant Research Conference, hosted in 2011, created a vital link between academic research and practitioners. This culminated in the BC Research Road Map, which was developed to identify the key future needs and priorities for invasive plant research in BC.

Building on this foundation, the ISCBC has since hosted a research conference on average every three years to maintain these important linkages and connections.





About the Speakers and Conference Themes

In 2021, fifty respected researchers engaged in invasive species related studies will share their findings and insights with conference attendees.

The program will include two esteemed keynote speakers; a series of concurrent themed presentation sessions each followed by Q&A with a facilitated panel discussion at the conclusion of the theme topic; a poster session, and plenty of networking opportunities. A moderated workshop will be hosted to gather input about invasive species research needs in BC to inform updates to the BC Research Road Map. Recordings of all presentations will be accessible by attendees following the Conference.

Meet Keynote Speaker Laura Meyerson!

Laura Meyerson is a Professor at University of Rhode Island, director of the Restoration Ecology minor and the Environmental Science minor. She is the Associate Editor-in-Chief for *Biological Invasions* and an Associate Editor for *Neobiota*. She is an international Science advisor for the Center for Invasion Biology, Stellenbosch University in South Africa, is currently leading a chapter on trends in biological invasions for the forthcoming IPBES report on invasive species, As a post-doc, Dr. Meyerson was an AAAS Fellow with the US EPA and NISC working on biosecurity, and a research scientist at the Smithsonian where she worked with the Global Invasive Species Program on two global assessments for the Convention on Biological Diversity. Dr. Meyerson earned her doctorate in 2000 from Yale University, School of Forestry and Environmental Studies.





About the Attendees

Past conference attendees have shown diverse interests in invasive species research and management, and has included representatives of non-profits, stewardship groups, academics, business and industry and Indigenous, local, provincial, and federal governments. In 2021, we expect a gathering of more than 250 participants from all corners of North America.

2020 Participants Worked in the Following Areas:

- Terrestrial plants = 80%
- Aquatic plants = 41%
- Aquatic invertebrates = 20%
- Terrestrial invertebrates = 16%
- Fish = 15%
- Reptiles/amphibians = 13%
- Mammals = 9%
- AII = 8%
- Birds = 6% Fungi/Microorganisms = 3%

Feedback from the nearly 250 participants at the 2020 ISCBC Research Symposium indicated both a need for, and a keen interest in, knowledge exchange opportunities related to invasive species research. Professional development; general education; access to new research; networking opportunities; and exploring practical application of research were cited as the top reasons for attending the Symposium.






