- Search for your address in this [interactive map](#) of BC's Local Government Administrative Areas to determine your regional district and municipality
- Next search for your regional district/municipality on [Civic Info BC](#) to find specific information including contact, address, and website information
- Send an email or call to introduce the CDD project, ask for permission to install CDD signs at the given coordinates, and inquire about standards for sign posts.

Installation Tips

CDD signs come predrilled to allow for easy installation. Partners are expected to cover the costs of installing the signs and ensuring that the installation (wooden posts vs. metal, distance from the shoreline, etc.) adheres to the rules and regulations of the site jurisdiction. There is a space in the logo section of the signs for Partners to insert their own if they so choose.

Note: Partners are responsible for acquiring and installing posts for the CDD signs, but some helpful tips can be found below

- If your jurisdiction has a standard post they use, ensure that you are using the correct posts. Some organizations may provide signposts to you, especially if they want consistent posts at

sites. This is dependent on the region and the jurisdiction in charge of the site. Partners are responsible for following up to see if this is a possibility.

- Signs come predrilled to compliment a standard metal signpost. Only one post is required as the holes are drilled into the center of the top and bottom of the sign.
- Bolts, nuts and washers will be required if the post is thin.
- Wooden posts of various dimensions can be easily purchased from Rona, Home Hardware and local fencing suppliers.
- Looking to order metal posts? Check out [UBS Industries](#), who we have ordered from in the past. The posts come in two pieces and are very easy to install.
