



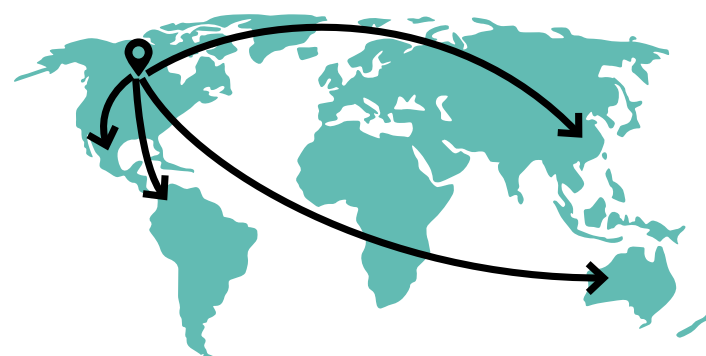
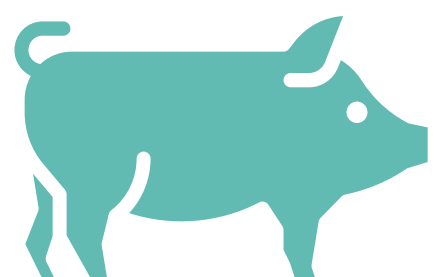
INVASIVE PIGS?

Invasive pigs include Eurasian boars, domestic pigs, and their hybrids that have escaped, been released or were born in the wild.

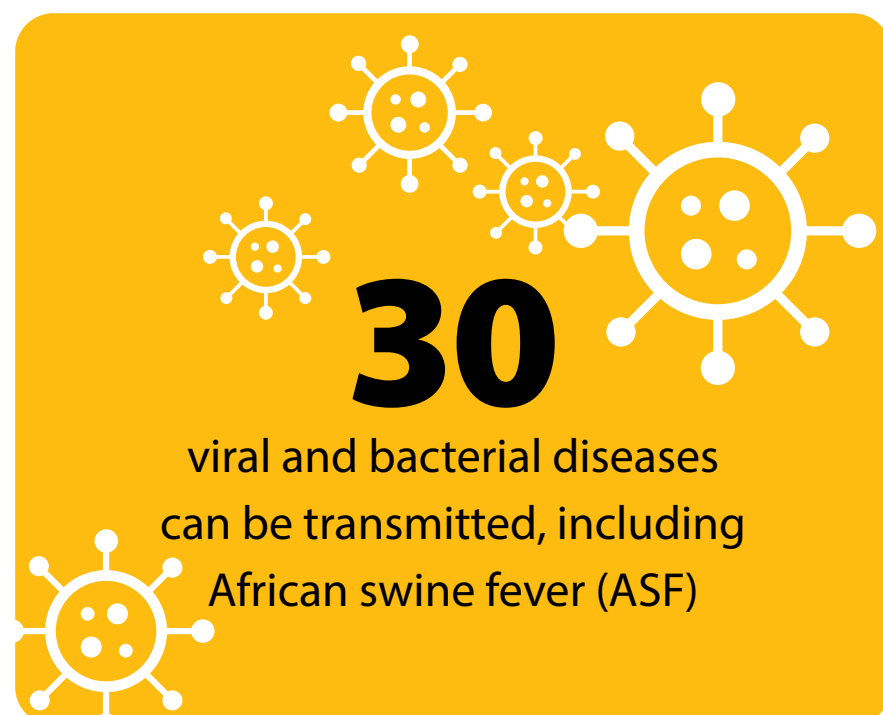

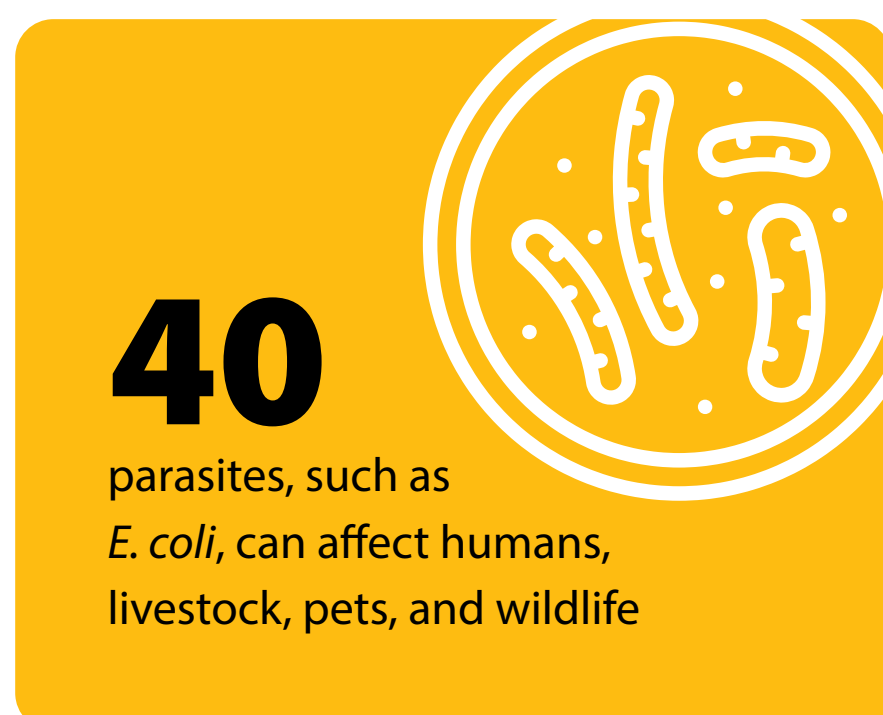
Invasive pigs consume key crops such as corn, oil seeds, canola, and wheat

viral and bacterial diseases can be transmitted, including African swine fever (ASF)



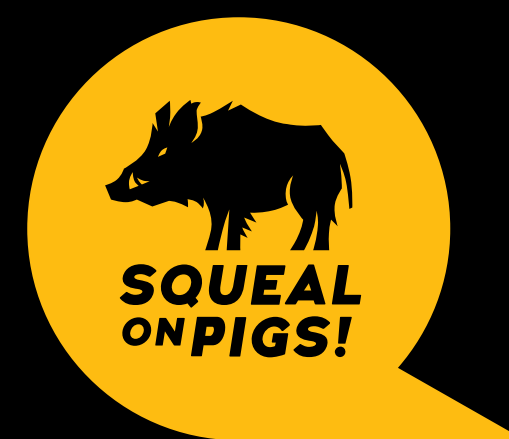
parasites, such as *E. coli*, can affect humans, livestock, pets, and wildlife

AFRICAN SWINE FEVER (ASF) is a contagious viral disease that only affects pigs. With no treatment available, ASF poses a great risk to Canada's pork industry and economy.
