


INVASIVE PIGS?

IMPACTS OF INVASIVE PIGS









Hunting is **NOT** an effective control option. **Why?**



- 1. Hunting can cause pigs to disperse to new areas
- 2. Hunting can make pigs more elusive

AFRICAN SWINE FEVER (ASF) is a contagious viral disease that only affects pigs. With no treatment available, ASF poses a great risk to Canada's pork industry and economy.

BIOSECURITY KEEPS CANADIAN PIGS SAFE!

Use escape-proof barriers to limit wildlife contact, use clean designated gear, properly dispose of waste, ensure feed quality, and designate an area for sick or injured pigs.

If one of your pigs escapes:

CONTAIN THE SITUATION: Guide the pig back to its enclosure with food or temporary barriers.

SECURE FENCING: Once contained, check and reinforce all fences and gates.
